From the Pastor

Strong into the Night *He who trusts in the LORD will be exalted.* <u>*PROVERBS* 29:25</u>

In September 1939, Great Britain allied with France and

several other alarmed countries in declaring war on Hitler's Germany, which had invaded Poland in its intended march toward global domination. By the end of the year, <u>anxieties</u> throughout England remained on high alert; everyone was fearful of bombing and invasion.

When King George VI sat down before two large microphones to make his <u>Christmas</u> Day speech to the nation, he was dressed in his official uniform as Admiral of the Fleet. With so many parts of the world facing an uncertain future, his goal was to reassure the people that their nation was prepared and able and their cause right and just.

"A new year is at hand," the king said. "We cannot tell what it will bring. If it brings peace, how thankful we shall all be. If it brings us continued struggle, we shall remain undaunted."

Then, turning to some lines of poetry his wife had recently shared with him, he concluded his speech with these words, which are a fitting close to our year together. They offer a word of encouragement that—we hope—will settle your hearts amid the troubles of our own era in history. These lines are from "The Gate of the Year," a poem written in 1908 by Minnie Louise Haskins:

I said to the man who stood at the gate of the year "Give me a light that I may tread safely into the unknown."

And he replied, "Go into the darkness and put your hand into the hand of God That shall be to you better than light and safer than a known way!" As you make the turn to a new year, what are you facing that needs you to sink your hand more deeply into God's hand? Pray for one another that as you

"Do not be discouraged, for the LORD your God will be with you wherever you go." <u>Joshua 1:9</u> —

On the first day of a new year many of us wish each other a "Happy New Year!" But as we begin a new year, we need more than a hopeful greeting from the people around us. We need to listen to what God told Joshua about 3,400 years ago. As Joshua was about to lead God's people into the promised land, he had reason to be afraid. He had an enormous task ahead of him, and he was well aware of the dangers that he and the people would soon be facing. He needed God's encouragement. A new year brings lots of questions: Will our health hold? Will our marriage last? Will I be able to hang on to my job? Will I get into the right school? Will I live to see the end of this year? Will the economy improve? Will there be a terrorist attack or some natural disaster that takes me or my loved ones? The Creator of the universe comes to us and says, "Don't be afraid; don't be discouraged." What happens in this coming year is not left to chance. God is in charge, and he promises to stay close: "The LORD your God will be with you wherever you go." Many years later, the Lord Jesus made the same promise when he said, "I am with you always" (Matthew 28:20). That's the reason we can wish each other a "Happy New Year!"

Timothy Keller's book, <u>The Reason for God, Belief</u> in an Age of Skepticism.

Quoting from the back of the book, "The Reason for God, the founding pastor of Redeemer Presbyterian Church in New York City, Timothy Keller, addresses the frequent doubts that skeptics, and even ardent believers, have about religion. Using literature, philosophy, real-life conversations, and potent reasoning, Keller explains how the belief in a Christian God is, in fact, a sound and rational one."

Now this next part of the description seems to apply to us at BPC: "To true believers he offers a solid platform on which to stand their ground against the backlash to religion created by the Age of Skepticism.

Imagine, during the last nine months of the COVID-19 pandemic, that in addition to having your place of worship closed, you did not have any Christian literature in your own language to give you encouragement. Imagine, too, that if you were caught speaking with <u>anyone</u> about your faith, you might be imprisoned for many months.

This is the plight of the Christians living in Iran, the country ranked #9 by Open Door.org. for persecuting those who worship Jesus Christ.
