Session Meeting took place on November 16,
2021 at 4:00 p.m. in the library. In
attendance were Pat Collins, (Treasurer),
Jamie Horn, Sue Hosterman, Fred Shin, Rev.
Josyph Andrews, Moderator, and Marsha
Spinner, Clerk. Billy Don Weaver was away.
A quorum was present.

Pastor Josyph opened the meeting with a prayer.

After a time for "Sharing and Caring," Pastor Josyph gave a lesson based on readings from Romans 3:20-24 and Romans 6:1-4.

Josyph gave the Session his Pastor's Report. The Session received the Treasurer's Report from Pat.

The following decisions were made:

- to appropriate \$55 for Emma Scott, a few dollars more than the original \$50 allotted.
- that PW use The Mavericks' classroom shelves for an on-going book borrow/purchase for a "buck"/trade beginning in January.
- to have the January communion on the second Sunday of the month as Jason Fry, guest minister on the first Sunday when communion is normally served, is a Methodist. (A Presbytery ruling.)
- to offer a Lenten study on Thursday mornings at 9:30 in Library, running through weeks of Lent and concluding on first Thursday of Eastertide. Possible book: *Telling the Truth, the Gospel as Comedy, Tragedy and Fairy Tale* by Frederick Buechner. Sue Hosterman would lead. Motion passed.
- to elect Janie Howell to represent Burnet Presbyterian Church at LACare meetings, replacing Hap Zimmerman.

• to engage the McBride accounting firm to make a financial review for the year 2021.

While other issues were discussed, no other decisions were made.

The meeting was duly adjourned. The next meeting is scheduled for December 14.

Josyph closed the meeting with a prayer.

** Praying for Persecuted Christians

Vietnam is #19 on the World-Wide Watch List of persecuted Christians as noted by Open Doors.org. Almost ten percent of the population professes to be Christian. Here is the story of one young couple:

'We have received healing and blessing from our Lord. He has changed our lives. We will not deny our faith as you have demanded." Ai and Liem.

Ai and Liem, whose names we've changed for security reasons, are new Christians in Vietnam. The repercussions that greeted their new faith in Jesus highlight the severe opposition converts from indigenous backgrounds can face. The couple became Christians after Ai was healed of sickness when a local church prayed for him. They shared their new faith with their family, and a small house church was birthed which grew to six families (30 people).

In July 2020, villagers and local authorities stopped a church service and beat some of the congregation. Church members were cut off from a government-funded subsidy program for the poor, and in August the six Christian families were

excluded from government Covid-19 aid. In September, villagers destroyed the believers' properties. Their rice harvest was burned, two cows were slaughtered and another was severely injured, yet they remain faithful to Jesus Christ.

Please continue to pray for persecuted Christians around the world and for Open Doors.org who continue to support these brave people.
